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Foreword

ndia being one of the leading countries in biodiversity conservation and protection of threatened biodiversity including avifauna, significant major initiatives towards this direction have been taken in the national context by the Ministry of Environment Forests and Climate Change (MoEFCC) through policy documents such as India's National Wildlife Action Plan (NWAP) for wildlife conservation and Visionary Perspective Plan (VPP) specifically for conservation of Avifauna. As the next logical step envisioned in the VPP, preparation of State level action plans for seventeen states, were undertaken by Sálim Ali Centre for Ornithology and Natural History (SACON), the South India Centre of Wildlife Institute of India, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Govt. of India.

The state of Chhattisgarh represents one of the highly diverse areas in terms of biodiversity in the country. It is a challenging task to conserve this rich and diverse biological wealth in the current age of climate change and human pressure. Scientific documentation and objective prioritization and guidelines for conservation actions for various taxa is crucial for the effective conservation of biological diversity. With an exhaustive compilation of the status of the state's Ornithological history and future directive for avifaunal conservation efforts in the state, the present State Action Plan document for Chhattisgarh is an impressive step towards this goal. With over 500 bird species reported from the state, the state accounts for almost 39% of the total avifaunal diversity of India. The action plan has identified priority actions under various relevant Programmes envisioned in the national VPP, including neglected aspects such as conservation of avifauna outside Protected Areas and developmental Impacts on bird populations.

I am sure that the State Action Plan for conservation of Avian diversity, their ecosystems habitats of and Landscapes in Chhattisgarh is a useful and handy document for policy makers and researchers. I congratulate the entire team involved in the preparation of this State Action Plan as well as all those who provided various inputs, comments, and suggestions during the development of this action plan. Upon preparation of VPP, SACON as a nodal agency has prepared the State level Action Plan for Chhattisgarh during Phase I of implementation of VPP. The VPP document is used as guideline to prepare the State level Action Plan (SAP) of the state.

Chhattisgarh is a heavily forested state of Central India with 42.8% forest cover on its total geographical area. It has three National Parks and eleven Wildlife Sanctuaries. The state has 501 bird species recorded. Conservation

ndia has a diversified range of natural habitats and priority identification is necessary to protect the avifauna landscapes that are host to a diverse range of species, in the state. This SAP report shall serve as a road map



This Action plan identifies priority areas for bird conservation challenges and activities through the following 14 programmes (out of 16 programmes identified in the national level VPP*) as applicable to the state of Chhattisgarh.

- 1. Conservation of rare, endangered & threatened (RET) bird species of India and implementation of species recovery plans (SRPs)
- 2. Conservation of important bird & biodiversity areas (IBAs) of the country outside protected area (PA) network
- 3 Conservation of protected areas (PAs) with high avian diversity
- 4. Conservation of avian diversity at the landscape level
- 5. Conservation of inland aquatic ecosystems with high avian diversity
- 6. Conservation of coastal and marine ecosystems with high avian diversity
- 7. Conservation of migratory birds
- 8. Impacts of developmental projects and other anthropogenic activities on avian diversity and habitats
- 9. Curbing illegal trafficking of birds in India
- 10. Conservation of avian diversity in urban areas
- 11. Surveillance and monitoring of avian diseases
- 12. National plan for nature education and awareness for conservation of avian diversity, their ecosystems, habitats & landscapes
- 13. National capacity building programme for protection and monitoring of avian diversity, their ecosystems, habitats & landscapes
- 14. Mainstreaming conservation of avian diversity with other government of India schemes and programmes
